

Bus Trip To Outtrim March 25

A letter from Libby:

Hello my historical (hysterical) friends.

I do hope you can all come on a bus trip to Korumburra and to our place at Outtrim sometime in March next year. I think you would all really enjoy the day. We are only 90 minutes away from Mornington.

Morning coffee stop will be at Korumburra and there is a great local history display in the lovely new Community Hub building.

Outtrim is another 20 minutes on.

The history of the Outtrim area is amazing. The only remaining building apart from farms is Outtrim Hall at the reserve and remnants of a area was hugely cleared from dense timber when coal was discovered. Railways, bridges, banks, post office, school, all manner of stores were built and the township thrived until a bushfire and then the coal petered out. Many of the buildings were taken by bullock dray to Wonthaggi.

I can tell you more of this story on the day and plan to have delicious bread, Gippsland cheeses, pickles and fruit platters for lunch.

Look forward to seeing you."

The date is yet to be confirmed. (We should have the date at the Christmas luncheon). The bus will leave the Car Park behind the shopping centre off Waterloo Place, near footy ground at 9.30 sharp.
