

Mornington Fire Brigade in the 1950's & 60's

Victorian Fire Brigade Volunteers State Championships are one of Victoria's proudest and longest traditions, running for many years.

The State Championships have been held annually since 1874, when the first State Championship was held in Melbourne, The only cancellations have been due to World War 1, World War 11 and the Covid pandemic.

In the 1950's the rural State Championships were developed to reflect the unique skills of rural brigades.

The Competitions started out as 'Demonstrations' with the introduction of hose reels into the fire service in the mid 1800's. This was to assist in getting hose and other equipment to the scene of the fire faster. Brigades soon found that competing with other brigades improved their firefighting training and efficiency.

When it was Mornington's turn it was time to gather down at Mornington Park with the training track and the water tower standing ready for the competitions to start.

Finishing the day with a spectacular torchlight procession through the town.

Recipes From The Past

Do you have a glut of cucumbers or zucchini? You can use either. Here is an old recipe to give you a pickle for cheese or cold meats.

Bread and Butter Pickle

2 Kg cucumbers or zucchini

3 medium onions

1 green or red pepper

2 cloves garlic

 $1 \frac{1}{2}$ tsb. salt

1/2 ltr. cold water

2 1/2 cups sugar

1 1/2 cups cider vinegar

1 tsp. mustard seeds

1 tsp turmeric

Slice the unsealed cucumbers/ zucchini finely. Slice the onions and pepper. Tie the garlic

in muslin. Make a brine with the salt and cold water and soak all veg. in basin for at least 3 hours. Drain well and put in preserving pan with the remaining ingredients. Heat to boiling stirring occasionally to dissolve sugar. Remove the garlic and pour into warmed dried jars and seal immediately.
